Staff Survey

Each year we complete Department of Education surveys for parents, students and staff. We have recently received the results of our staff survey with some very good results.

We are above the state average, network average and 'similar' schools average in all the measures of: school climate, staff safety and wellbeing, teaching and learning and school leadership.

Highlights for us were:

- School climate 86% positive compared to a state average of 78%
- School staff safety and wellbeing 78% positive compared to a state average of 74%

The day that Australia will celebrate World Teachers' Day this year will be Friday 27th October. This is a wonderful opportunity to thank all of our staff for their commitment, care and support of our students each day.



The Netball coach will be Campbell Brown who plays in the Victoria 17s team and Jayden Cowling who plays in the Victoria men's team.



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
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
