Primary Years Programme

PYP focus in Year 3

Last Thursday, the Year 3's ventured to Twisted Science in Moorabbin. It was a fun filled day with lots of hands on science activities that enabled us to make valuable connections to our How *The World Works* unit of inquiry. We got lots of ideas to help us choose our science experiments for the upcoming Science Expo.

How The World Works

Central Idea: Different reactions occur when everyday substances interact. We spent some time in the Play Zone where we got to make our own discoveries with air, light, magnets, construction and virtual landscapes. The students were encouraged to be curious, creative and connect with each other in a casual setting where learning was open ended and fun.



We participated in a workshop called "It's Chemistry" where we explored the differences between physical and chemical reactions and investigated the properties of both. We separated two different mixtures using a magnet and chromatography. We also manufactured some very long chemical strings in one of the coolest chemical reactions.











There is no better way to end an excursion than with a picnic lunch and play at Bricker Reserve before heading back home. We look forward to our next excursion and congratulate all the children on representing AGPS and demonstrating our learner profile attributes.

AGPS Snow Camp 2022


