Mock Year 7 Week

This week our Year 6s have had a 'mock' Year 7 week. This forms part of the process of setting our students up for a successful transition to secondary school. The week aims to give our students a better understanding of the organisation skills needed to read the timetable, organise the resources they require for their lessons and move between classes. The lessons have been developed around some of the subjects they might experience at secondary school. These include lessons on: Psychology, Journalism, Health and Human Development, Poetry, Photography, Science, Geography, Debating, Biology and secondary school skills development.

Bike Education

The Year 4 students have now completed their Bike Education training and have been putting these skills into practice within our local area. This program has certainly improved their cycling control, awareness of others and road rules. We hope that this will set them up for a safe and enjoyable cycling future.



Year 5 Leadership Speeches

The Year 5 students have been considering whether they would like to apply for one of the Year 6 leadership positions for 2024. The leadership positions are School Captains, House Captains, LOTE leaders, Performing Arts leaders, Visual Art leaders, Library leaders, STEM leaders and Environmental leaders and Sports leaders. On Tuesday I was fortunate to listen to the leadership speeches from our Year 5 cohort of students. The quality of their speeches was excellent and many of them, although they faced initial nerves, felt a real sense of achievement afterwards. In a number of speeches we heard students say that in Year 6, they were all leaders. Although a selected number of students will receive the leadership positions, larger groups of students will have an active role in these areas throughout the year.

Book Week Term 3 Narratives

Based around Book Week, students across the school had a focus on narrative writing. The students were very creative in their plots, characters and vocabulary choices. This week the students' library has

been open at lunchtime for students to share their narratives with each other. It has been very rewarding for the students to share their stories to a 'live' audience.

The support of our volunteers allows us to run so many more programs effectively, thus providing our students with a richer experience of school. Year Level Structures in 2024

After consultation with the staff and working around our budget for 2024, we would like to share with the community, our class structures for 2024. We know that our parents and teachers value having straight year groups and not composite classes, which we have maintained. In line with the Victorian Schools' Agreement, we aim to keep the junior classes smaller where possible. I know our excellent staff will again support the learning and wellbeing needs of all of our students in 2024.

- 4 x Year 1 classes averaging 17 students per class
- 4 x Year 2 classes averaging 24 students per class
- 3 x Year 3 classes averaging 22 students per class
- 4 x Year 4 classes averaging 23 students per class
- 4 x Year 5 classes averaging 22 students per class
- 4 x Year 6 classes averaging 27 students per class

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RSPCA Donations



Two weeks ago, the Year 5s went on an excursion to the RSPCA Education Centre. While there, we saw cute animals, patted goats, sheep and Lexie the dog, and learnt about the wonderful work the RSPCA does in the community. This linked in with our 'Sharing the planet' unit of inquiry.

RSPCA stands for the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. Did you know there is a reason for the word 'Royal' at the front? It is because the Queen visited one time and thought the organisation was doing an amazing job.

If you didn't know, the RSPCA is a team that helps and rescues injured and mistreated animals. Some animals are found on the side of the road or are found wandering along streets where they have been abandoned by their owner. This is why we have the RSPCA.

When we went to the RSPCA, we found out this big problem! The RSPCA needs approximately 45 million dollars each year to look after the animals. Only 6% of this comes from the government. Most of the money the RSPCA receives goes to caring for the animals. That's why they need donations. We would love you to help!

How to help

Some ways you can help is by volunteering, adopting, foster caring and donating. You can volunteer when you are over 15 years old. Things you can donate are old blankets, newspaper, sheets and sealed litter and pet food. The RSPCA cannot accept pillows, doonas or anything with feathers in it because the animals rip them up.




