FROM OUR ACTING PRINCIPAL

With the unsettled weather of the past fortnight, we extend our thoughts to those communities who have been affected by the storms and more recently the fires. We have had a couple of 'hot weather' timetables where the students have stayed inside, but on the whole our students have been able to have recess and lunchtimes outside and have been able to use our school grounds as an extension of their learning. As we move from summer to autumn, the weather is likely to become more changeable. Parents, please remind your children to bring appropriate school clothes in their bags for changes in weather.

The end of February marks the end of the Foundation students' assessment days, so from next week they will be joining us for the full 5 days. They have achieved a few milestones over the past 5 weeks and this was another step along the way. Students investigated the importance of physical movement, social connection, balanced nutrition and mindfulness.

Maths at AGPS

Our students have begun the year with some enjoyment and fun! Each year level has begun their exploration into all aspects of Maths and its place in our world. At AGPS we believe that students can learn and practise foundational skills through the use of games. This encourages enjoyment within Maths and is something that we value highly. Our Foundation students have all received their Maths Packs which include a variety of hands-on resources to explore different games.

We have dedicated our Friday Maths session to the review of previously taught maths concepts and recall of key maths vocabulary, as well as a focus on developing maths fluency. To improve our teaching of maths, our Maths Leaders have been working closely with the Kingston school network, participating in rich discussion and sharing good practise.

Parent / Teacher Communications

We do encourage parents to make contact with their child's teachers, to discuss progress, goals, academic, social / emotional needs. We do have a 3-step approach for addressing issues when they arise. These are detailed later in this newsletter.

Parent Feedback

This week we will be sending out a survey to parents on Compass. This survey is to capture our parent community's opinions of our information sharing at the start of the year. This includes the student questionnaire, the parent information sessions and the invite to meet for a 1-to-1 session with the classroom teacher. We would appreciate any feedback you may have, so that we can tailor these to the needs of our parents. The Compass post will have some information for parents regarding how they can support their child's learning in Maths and English. We will also have a follow-up session later in the term for parents to ask any questions of our Learning Specialists relating to how you can assist with your child's learning.

Tryouts Report



Carnival in Term 1.




Following the tryouts, **32 students** have been selected to represent AGPS at the **Chelsea & Patterson District Swimming Carnival** this **Friday 1st March**.




