Year 6 Graduation

Our Year 6 cohort have been busy planning for and organising their Graduation. The students are working in groups to create the different aspects of the Graduation ceremony. These committees are made up of Formalities (invitations, running order, speech writing, Decorations (designs of spaces, table decorations, name tags), Entertainment (song selections, choreography,



props) and Digital Tech (program design, student videos, student photo slideshow). Class Structures for 2024

The end of the year is fast approaching so we thought we would end 2023 with a few updates:

Wonder Recycling Rewards Program

In Term 2, our school participated in the Wonder Recycling Rewards program to help reduce the number of plastic bread bags that are ending up in landfill. Our school saved almost 15kg of plastic bags from this fate, which will now be recycled into an oil that is used to make more food packaging. We

Mr King has pumped up the balls and added these into our sports borrowing bins. A massive thank you to everyone who helped us to earn these items, they will be enjoyed by all students.

Term 4 Environmental Leaders' Excursion

On Tuesday the 14th of November, the Year 6 Environmental Leaders attended a Dolphin Research Institute Marine Ambassadors excursion. We made our way down to Stony Point Pier to board a boat bound for Seal Rocks. Unfortunately the weather was unpredictable and the swell very large, so we were unable to exit the heads and venture into Bass Strait, but our captain had a back up plan! Instead, the boat took us around the

world famous Phillip Island, past San Remo and to the beautiful granite cliffs at Cape Woolamai. The views were spectacular, the wind was icy, and overall, we had a wonderful experience, and we did see one seal sunbathing on the rocks at the bottom of the cliffs!
