FROM OUR ACTING PRINCIPAL

Welcome back to Term 4. I hope that our families had a wonderful break and enjoyed some quality family time together. We were very fortunate to have some beautiful weather over the break and have really experienced the seasons of Melbourne this week. The next ten weeks will be a key time for us to develop the students' wellbeing and learning progress, before the summer break. We will be using our student data, and our three school surveys (parents/carers, students and staff), to evaluate the programs that we run and the areas of improvement we



have been working on in 2023. This will give us the information we need to prioritise our goals and actions for 2024.

Footy Day

Unfortunately our Footy Day which was scheduled for Wednesday had to be postponed again, due to bad weather. This will now be held next Tuesday (10th October). We have been assured by the Bureau of Meteorology that this day will provide suitable weather. Year 2 Sleepover at School

This week our Year 2s will have their first introduction to our camp program by experiencing their school sleepover. The students were very excited today as they arrived at school with their sleeping bags, pillows, bags and casual clothes. They participated in an incursion, provided by Supreme Incursions, which involved team initiative activities. After school the students will have some fun games, followed by a pizza dinner, disco and a movie. The students will then bed down for a (good) night's sleep. On Friday the students will continue on with their camp activities. This will be a very special time for our Year 2s and we hope they have loads of fun.







School Uniforms and Sun Smart

A reminder that students are expected to follow our uniform policy and wear school uniform. With the changeable weather, students will need to be prepared for warm conditions and cold / wet conditions. On days when the UV is moderate to high, students are encouraged to apply sunscreen before school. It is useful if students can have an easy to apply sunscreen in their bags to reapply later on in the day to ensure they are well protected. We are in the process of submitting our SunSmart policy and procedures, so that we continue to be a SunSmart school. We have now had our SunSmart accreditation for 21 years, which is a fantastic effort.

Transition Sessions

Next Thursday (12th October) our 2024 Foundation cohort will be attending school as part of their transition process. They will have an hour long school experience over the next four Thursdays. Our current Foundation students will not go into their classrooms at the start of these days, but will line up outside the Foundation rooms in the courtyard, ready to be taken off to an alternative space for the hour.

Year 3 Camp Next Week

Next week our Year 3 students will be going to Mount Evelyn for their three day camp. This YMCA camp is excellent for an introductory camp for our younger students. The peaceful setting in the Dandenong Ranges offers an amazing backdrop for an action packed camp. The Netball coach will be Campbell Brown who plays in the Victoria 17s team and Jayden Cowling who plays in the Victoria men's team.




