FROM OUR ACTING PRINCIPAL

It has been wonderful to see our students making the most of our school grounds and facilities for their learning. This term the Year 2s have been introduced to the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program. This has involved introductions to the kitchen utensils, kitchen safety education and cooking, as well as familiarisation of the



garden and some of the tools. The students have also been busy in the garden tending their garden beds for the Spring Flower Competition. Students have been enjoying their first sessions of bike education on the basketball court. They have been improving their control of their bicycles. This program will include bike safety, road rules and developing a greater awareness of other people and vehicles. This will culminate in a road ride around our local neighbourhood. The Year 5 students have been making use of the outside space to put into practice some of their understanding about measurement in their Maths sessions.

School Improvement



This week the staff had a follow up session from our learning that we participated in during our August pupil free day. Mardi Gorman (a Literacy consultant) visited school to model some of the teaching strategies she has taught us previously. This was an excellent opportunity for the staff to continue their learning, see the strategies in practice and ask any clarifying questions. The rich conversations the staff had during the day will continue on, as we look to continually improve our best teaching practice in reading.

It's Academic

Today four of our Year 5 students, Charlotte, Josh, Charli and William went to Mordialloc College to compete in the *It's Academic* competition. This was a general knowledge quiz run by Mordialloc College students for the local primary schools. Our students did well and enjoyed the experience.

Year 3 Camp

The students had an enjoyable time at camp at Mount Evelyn. Although the weather was wet for some of the time, the YMCA staff managed to rearrange the schedule so that all the students could experience each activity. Year 4 Camp

This week our Year 4s are at Camp Manyung, in Mount Eliza. They have had two days of beautiful weather so far. The Netball coach will be Campbell Brown who plays in the Victoria 17s team and Jayden Cowling who plays in the Victoria men's team.




